

Godalming Town Football Club – Ground Rules

All persons entering the ground of Godalming Town FC will be subject to the following ground rules:

1. Godalming Town FC (hereafter referred to as “the club” reserves the right to eject any person who is considered by the club to have behaved inappropriately on the Club premises or at a match involving the club away from home. Examples of inappropriate behaviour which could give lead to ejection include:

- Using obscene or abusive language
- Using terms of abuse whether racial, sexual or otherwise
- Being under the influence of alcohol or drugs
- Entering the field of play without permission
- Behaving in a manner likely to bring either the club or the game into disrepute
- Behaving in a manner which interferes with the comfort, enjoyment or safety of other spectators.

The club may at its absolute discretion, bar from entry any persons prosecuted or ejected under this rule for such a length of time as it sees fit.

2. Any person barred from the ground shall not enter or attempt to enter the premises of the club during the term of any such bar, and any person found on the club premises or property during such term may be reported to the police.
3. No person may bring alcohol into the ground without the permission of the Club.
4. The climbing of floodlight pylons, stands or any other buildings is forbidden.
5. All authorised users must park in the car park in such a way as to cause no obstruction to the access or exit routes of any emergency vehicles. The club reserves the right at its absolute discretion to remove any vehicle parked in contravention of this rule and shall not be liable for any damage caused.
6. Refund of cash admission charges paid at the turnstiles will only be made at the discretion of the club. The right of admission is reserved and may be refused without reason given.
7. If any person is barred for any breach of the aforementioned rules, he or she has the right of appeal to the Committee. Any such appeal must be made in writing and addressed to the Secretary, giving full reasons for such appeal, within 14 days of notification of any such ban.
8. The Committee reserves the right at its absolute discretion to alter these rules from time to time as it sees fit. Any such changes will be communicated in the manner that the Committee deems most suitable.
